Shorter, easy, weekday, and local trips are being planned - if you have any ideas please share them with the club . . .

At present, Blaze has offered to lead a couple trips to include weekday trips in 2024:

- A vernal pool/wildflower tour and general soils/geology of Beale Air Force Base April/Earth Week. Note: for that trip, base access requires submission of SSN, Driver's Lic # a week ahead for Security Forces approval (you need a clean record) and a Real ID to access base, access would only be from the Wheatland Gate. The benefit is little walking/flat ground, a surrey would be provided by Beale AFB for the tour at no cost, and as a botanist Blaze is an expert on the plants and natural history of the base. If the access requirements are disagreeable, we can change the trip to Beale Falls in Spenceville Wildlife area which is open to the public and a closer drive – but a much longer hike.
- The Devil's Postpile on the Tahoe National Forest likely the week of July 8.

Blaze will also reach out to the new owners of the Original 16:1 Mine in Allegehny to see if they would offer a mine tour, and hopefully at least a surface pick for some "Blue Jay" Mariposite and then a mine museum visit. Also, he will reach out to the North Star Mine Museum and see if we can do a private tour. Hopefully others can work with Sierra College for a natural history museum tour.

#### **Christmas Rock Painting Ideas for Kids**

Kids love painting and finding rocks and these simple Christmas Rock Painting Ideas for Kids are a great way to help inspire their imaginations. We love rock painting ideas for kids and originally used these to make story stones which are a great way to encourage a bit of creative storytelling too so I'll be telling you about both ways the rocks can be used with children and also sharing some more rock painting ideas (including some festive ones) that I think you'll love!



#### What You Will Need

Rocks – kind of obvious right? Try the Yuba River or Deer Creek, they're easy enough to find in gardens and clean up or you can buy them online – but why?



Pens – normal pens do not work well for this so you will need something a bit specialist, I used Chalkola pens (chalk pens) for these painted rocks but I really like these ones too. Some people use paints for rocks but as both me and my kids are used to holding pens we find them easier to draw with, go with what works for you.



Varnish – chalk paint can rub off stones after a while. While you're painting the stones it's actually pretty handy to have a paint that's not permanent (I've successfully removed the paint from kid's faces, hands, my dining table and the floor just with baby wipes or a wet cloth) but if you want these to last a long time and especially if you plan on hiding the rocks outside you'll need some varnish. You will have to experiment, but generally spray varnish works well.

#### How to Make Painted Rocks

In my opinion the most important part of painting rocks is that it's a fun activity for kids and adults and. My daughter has been doing squiggles on rocks over the years that have now turned into proper drawings but she's enjoyed the creativity and fun of it the whole time. Painting rocks really is a fun activity for kids and adults so I've kept these as really nice, simple ideas to inspire you and the kids and that are achievable.

To make these rocks I used a mixture of both the normal and earthy colored Chalkola pens to get the colors that I wanted. I like these pens because they're non-toxic and water based which means that any mistakes can be removed pretty easily with a baby wipe or a wet cloth.

When you are making your painted rocks make sure you leave time between each layer of paint drying otherwise the colors will bleed a bit.

Try decorating around the house, mantle, little baskets on the orderve table, etc. That way your kids can particpate meaningfully in the annual Christmas decoating traditions!

#### More Field Trip Notes

Field Trip Report: Trip to Markleeville, CA. October 14-15, 2023

Three rockhounds attended the dig, meeting at the Carson River Resort at 11 Am. On Saturday went in on the Leviotion Mine Road. There were no washouts. On the forest road, a sign was posted [NO OUTLET] we found 3 sizeable trees across the road just before the Spring watering troughs, Two-thirds the way in we could see the Morning Star Mine just 1/2 mile away. We collected at 5 spots on the way in and the way out, Rhyolite, yellow opalite, and jaspers. We also did some maintenance on the road 1.5 miles in, before the dead end.

We went over the short way in to Gene and John's campsite. The road up to the top of the mountain was also blocked by fallen trees. We drove up to the mine but the creek was 20" deep and 26" wide and u-shaped with vertical walls. We walked in, and I found 6 chunks of silver ore for Gene, about fist size. Lots of Iron pyrite, 20 mesh, all over the ground. Zane walked everywhere around and reported nothing grand found. The weather was great!
